The Islamic Community of As-Salam of Detroit is a non-profit, non-political, religious and educational institute.

The Masjid center serves the Muslim community in the Metropolitan Detroit Area by advancing the teachings of Islam. The center also hopes to become a bridge between the Muslim and non-Muslim communities here in Brightmoor to promote mutual learning and understanding.

There are 6 million Muslims in the United States and Islam is one of the fastest growing religions in the country. Most Arabs are Muslims, but most Muslims are not Arabs. Salah ("Muslim prayer") is one of the Five Pillars in the faith of Islam and is an obligatory religious duty for every Muslim that is a spiritual act of worship that is observed five times a day.

The Masjid center conducts daily congregational prayer at proper times. The center is open for



all five daily prayers. Everyone is welcome to attend these prayer services. The center also conducts:

- Marriages \ Marriage Counseling
- Youth weekend Islamic educational school and special occasion seminars
- Adult classes
- Youth activities
- Adult/youth counseling
- Community Service activities
- Community picnics



0% INTEREST HOME REPAIR LOANS

0% interest home repair loans from \$5,000 to \$25,000 are available to qualified Detroit homeowners who can afford a loan.

0% interest means homeowners can invest in their home and neighborhood while paying back only what they borrow.

YOUR HOME IS IN A DESIGNATED AREA. If you meet the requirements listed below, you can apply and are exempt from household income limits.

Who can apply?

This program is intended to reach as many Detroit homeowners as possible. Below are the minimum qualifications:

- Homeowners must own and occupy their home for at least six months prior to applying.
- See the website to verify if you live in a targeted area or are within income requirements.
- The minimum credit score is 560.
- Homeowner's insurance and taxes must be current.
- The homeowner must be able to afford the loan payments.

Eligible Projects:

If the home has health and safety hazards, those issues **must be addressed first** before other repairs can be made. The following are sample projects:
